The issuance of Executive Order 9066 resulted in the incarceration of thousands of Japanese-Americans. Between 1942 and 1945 ten camps were opened holding approximately 120,000 Japanese Americans. Manzanar, located in southern California, was the first. Additional camps were established in Arizona, Wyoming, Colorado, Utah and Arkansas.

Works by renown photographer, Ansel Adams, reveal the daily life at Manzanar. Concurrently, on view is work by Wendy Maruyama who analyzes the internment camps with a contemporary eye.
